ANNOUNCEMENTS

The Lord's Supper: Today we will celebrate the Lord's Supper at the end of our morning worship service. This sacrament consists of giving and receiving bread and wine (or juice) to show forth the death of Jesus and receive spiritual nourishment. The Lord's Supper is open to everyone who has confessed their faith in Jesus Christ alone for salvation, provided that they have received Christian baptism, are members in good standing in a Bible believing church, and who are not living with secret or unrepentant sin. If you have any questions about these restrictions then please speak with a pastor or elder after the service, we would love to discuss them with you.

Evening Worship: We will gather again as a congregation for worship tonight at 6:00 pm. All are invited to join us again as we hear from God in his word, bring our burdens to him in prayer, and respond to his gospel in song. Pastor Jim will be continuing our sermon series though the book of Hebrews.

Assistance Request Form: We are working with the PCA's Mission to North America (MNA) and their Disaster Response team here in WNC to meet your needs and the needs of those nearest to you. In order to do this, CRPC and MNA need your help to gather information. To that end, MNA has furnished us with an Assistance Request Form, and we ask that every household fill out one of these forms, no matter how insignificant any damage may seem to you. This is the quickest way for us to respond to the needs around us—though, it may take time to get to the work of recovery and clean up. Once we have these forms, we will be sending our own CRPC assessors to follow up with you and help guide you through any necessary steps prior to any recovery team efforts. From there, we will work with MNA and others to schedule these volunteers to come and begin repair and clean-up work. You may also fill this form out for family in WNC and/or neighbors in your area.
